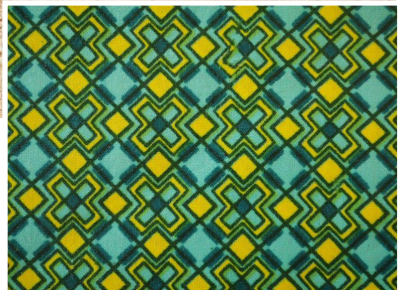


Abraham Njobvu

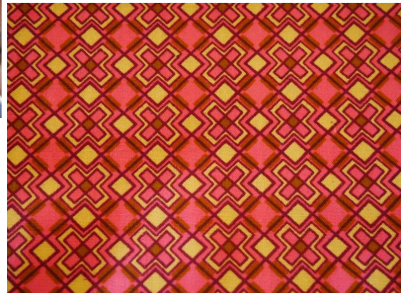

My name is Fanny Zulu. I am 19 years old. I live with my uncle and aunty, but both my parents are alive. I can describe myself as confident and loving.

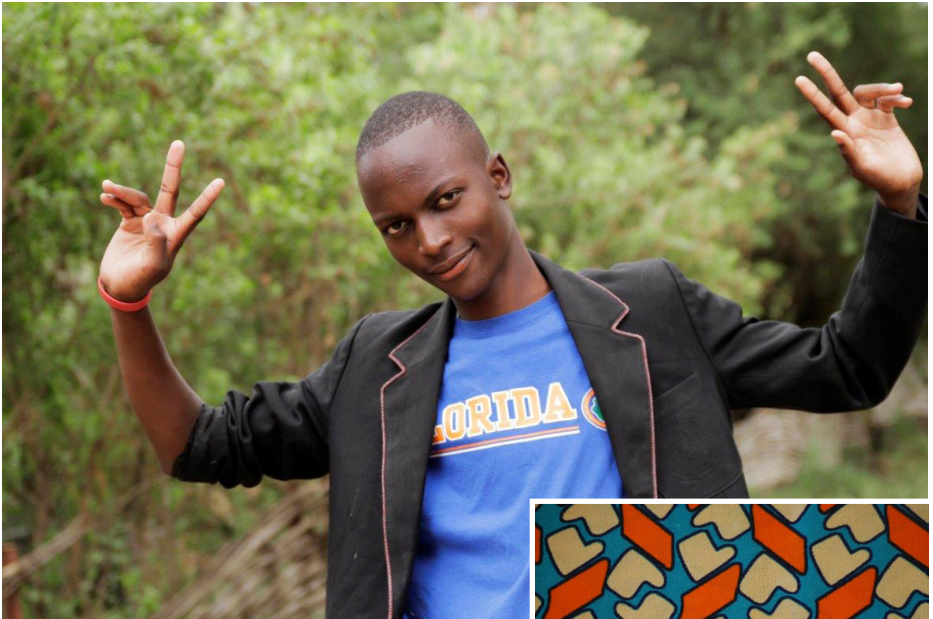
My favourite animal in Australia is kangaroo, and in Zambia I elephant because of shape and behaviour.

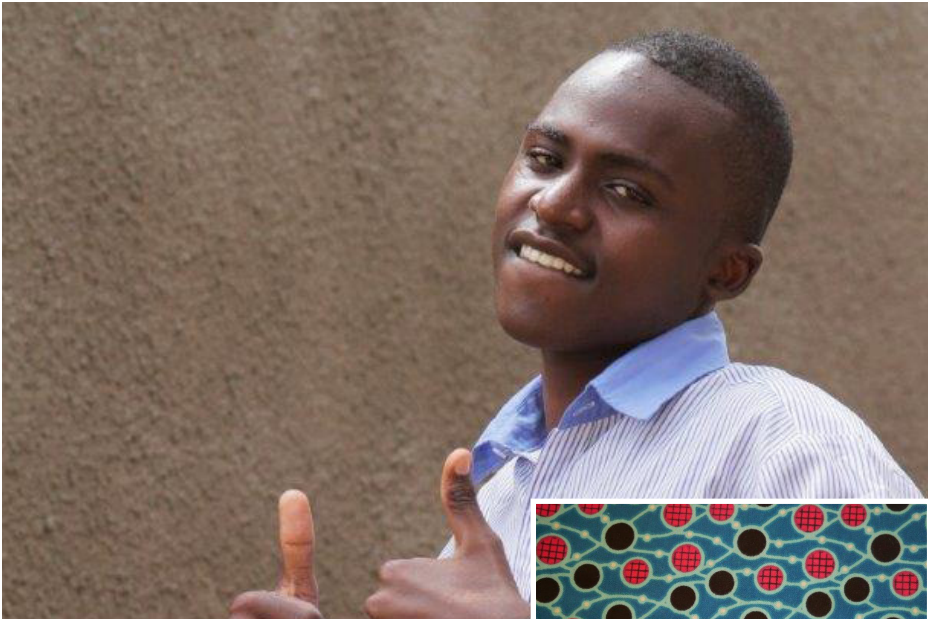

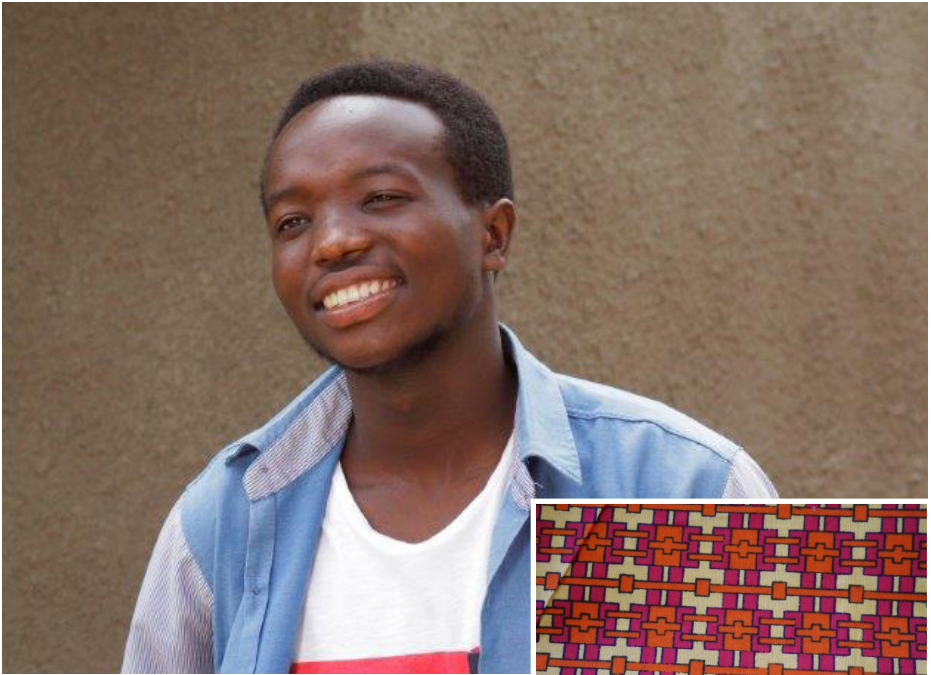
